We believe that sport not only contributes to the physical development of pupils but also makes a significant contribution to pupils' personal wellbeing and enjoyment of school. We look to inspire and engage children's interest in sporting activities through providing a wide range of opportunities within school, after school and within the wider community. We look to foster children's interest in physical wellbeing and healthy lifestyles in order to establish long lasting lifestyle messages. Furthermore, at Deerhurst we look to promote our Christian values through sports and positively encourage all children to take part in opportunities. We are proud of the PE curriculum and sporting opportunities that we offer. Our children have the opportunity to experience and gain skills in a wide variety of individual and team sports.

Through our learning community we participate in swimming galas, tag rugby, football, netball and rounders tournaments as well as inter school festivals, for example, football festivals for KS1. We also hold a successful competitive Sports Day during the Summer Term; the Sports Trophy is awarded to the winning house team at our final celebration assembly. We also award trophies to best Sports Girl and Best Sports Boy annually and these achievements can be seen recorded in our School Awards Book.

Through residential visits in years 5 and 6, children are able to take part in outdoor activity challenges such as archery, abseiling, dragon boat racing & trapeze.

We also have links with Cheltenham Town Football Club to provide after school activities and with Tewkesbury School to provide opportunities in a Secondary School environment.

Sports Premium

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary school head teachers.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools

Deerhurst and Apperley School was awarded the government grant of £8000 plus £5 for each child last year. This years funding has now been released 2016-17 will remain the same. We intend to use it in the following ways:

Confirmed impact 2016-17

- Membership of CNTDP ensured regular CPD, competitive sport opportunities, swimming and travel cover for some events
- Staff were able to access specific dance CPD through individual workshops
- Pupils received high quality dance teacher through expert coach
- Storage has been purchased to store some equipment
- EYFS were able to access 'rugby skills' through 'Rugby Tykes' provision and developed skills related to catching, throwing and developing listening skills
- All pupils took part in a dog safety talk to reinforce understanding of safety and well being
- 91% of our children took part in L2 (inter-school competitions)
- 100% of our children took in L1 competitions (intra school)
- All children take part in A Mile A Day
- Increased sports clubs have been made available such as fencing, archery (90% of children have taken part in extra- curricular sporting activities)
- 90% of children leaving school were able to swim at least 25 metres
- Sports Leaders have continued to develop across school and playground buddies are continuing to develop
- School is continuing to gather evidence for the Gold Award and results will be known in September 2017
- SEN and PP children have taken part in the Panathlon event for Glos
- 100% of EYFS children learnt to balance and use balanceability bikes
