The children had the most wonderful experience from a visit by Cain and his carer, Helen, known as Racing Through Barriers. Cain was born with cerebral palsy and shared his experience of what it is like to be a person with disabilities. The children could see how Cain communicated on his eye recognition device, hobbies he had and the obstacles in life he was met with. The children were so engaged and interested to interact with the whole experience and this developed their understanding of the barriers met by people with disabilities. They particularly liked the homework given by Cain - 'try to play the PlayStation with your feet'!
