GOVERNOR VISITS / ACTIVITIES

A significant part of school governance is coming into the school and meeting with staff, doing 'learning walks' and general monitoring of each aspect of school life. This term we've been involved in:

- **Pupil Progress meetings** every term Governors meet with respective class teachers, along with the Head, to discuss progress for every pupil in the school. Discussions focus on ensuring that each child is being properly challenged, and making the progress expected. Governors ensure that additional resources or interventions are put in place, if any gaps in attainment or progress are identified.
- **Reading visits each week** excellent reading is crucial for any outstanding school, and Governors try to play their part in supporting the children with regular visits to listen to children read.
- Monitoring of Vulnerable Groups an important role of Governors is to meet regularly with the Head and other staff to assess the progress of children in vulnerable groups – this includes those eligible for Pupil Premium and SEN children. At the recent visit, each child was discussed and their progress assessed. The report recognised that staff 'go beyond expectation for the school'.

Finance Committee

Another very important aspect of being a Governor, is monitoring the school's finances. Much has been reported in the news recently around financial challenges within the educational sector. Our School finances are carefully monitored, and the budget is approved through Committee. Our goal is to continue ensuring that our School does not run a budget deficit.

Sports Premium

Many of you will have noticed the addition of the sports track around the playing fields. Each school receives a Sports Premium to encourage heathy and active lifestyles for the children. The Governors are accountable for ensuring the Premium is spent appropriately and we think the track is a valuable addition – giving the children a place to complete their mile-a-day. The school also hopes to use the Premium to maintain its Gold Sports Award status.

Thanks to the PTA, whose great work continues to support the school by providing funds for crucial resources. They have recently helped fund several new laptops.
