Future Governor Opportunities

Our Governing Body is regularly changing and often in need of new members. If you feel that you may be able to give of your time and talents in the future, please come and chat with us, and we can keep you informed of potential opportunities. Two of the major matters of concern for Governors are School Finances and the children's learning. As parernts/carers, you can help:

School Finances

Much has been made of the challenging financial environment that is affecting many schools. Please be assured that our school is well run, with stable finances. However, one way parents/carers can really help is to contribute towards trips and outings the school puts on for the children. All contributions are of course voluntary, but swift payment helps the school tremendously.

Holidays in term time

We know this can be a sensitive issue, but we also know the difficult situation the school can be put in when children are missing during term time. Naturally, there is an impact on the learning of the child who is missing, but it can disrupt the planning for the class and have wider implications. Please do your best to minimise such disruptions!

GOVERNOR ACTIVITIES

The role of the Governors is concerned with school direction and strategy, rather than day to day running of the school, which falls to the Head Teacher. We meet with subject leaders, hold committee meetings, do 'learning walks' and monitor all aspects of school life. Classroom matters and other normal school concerns should first be raised with Class Teachers or the Head, rather than seeking out governors.

In recent weeks, our work has included:

Full Governing Body Meeting – this meeting is held regularly, with all governors present to provide and hear reports on every aspect of the School. Governors are expected to hold the Head Teacher to account for progress in learning, levels of attainment reached, attendance of all pupils and to determine if the School's strategic goals are being met.

Safeguarding – One role we take very seriously as governors is our efforts to ensure each child feels safe at school, and the school is following all necessary safeguarding practices. We monitor all such matters at every Governor meeting and ensure all protocols and policies are followed correctly. We can report that the school has had an annual safeguarding audit (by the GCSB), showing our processes to be robust, and we are fulfilling all of our obligations in respect to this important matter.

Foundation Subject Visits

On the Ofsted report (from January) the one item for school development was to ensure that the fantastic efforts being applied in core subjects (reading, writing and maths) would be applied across the curriculum as a whole.

We monitor how each subject is delivered across the school ensuring best practice is followed.
