


<p>Communication and Language</p> <p>We will have plenty of opportunity to develop our listening skills in the classroom. We will be listening to lots of stories and retelling them to each other during Story Making. We will be talking about the stories that we are reading and answering <i>why</i> and <i>how</i> questions. We will be taking part in lots of role play in our traditional tales cottage.</p>	<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p> <p>We will be learning how to draw and paint a self-portrait of ourselves. We will also be learning to draw different types of lines and shapes. We will explore the differences between fruits and vegetables using their senses (taste, texture, smell etc.)</p>	<p>Literacy</p> <p>Some of the books we are looking at this term include: <i>Goldilocks and the Three Bears; Three Little Pigs and lots of other traditional tales.</i> We will be learning to read and write initial sounds and will soon be blending them together to start reading! We will have lots of opportunity in the classroom to practise our writing, both independently on the writing table and also with the teacher's help.</p>	
<p>Physical Development</p> <p>We will be practising our fundamental Agility, Balance and Coordination (ABC) skills through games. On Mondays, the children will have Balanceability, which combines ergonomic balance bikes with a schedule of fun activities that build confidence, spatial awareness and dynamic balance skills. We will have plenty of opportunity to develop our fine motor skills by playing with: playdough, threading and practising using scissors. <p>Understanding the World</p> <p>As scientists and explorers, we will be learning all about your bodies and senses as well as to identify and name variety of common animals. _As historians, we will be learning about World War 2 as an event beyond our living memory. Children will learn to recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. Forest school with Mrs Cane will be on Mondays.</p>	<p>RE</p> <p>As we explore our school value of Respect this term and we will think about how we kindness to others as well as how we show respect. We will be thinking about what makes every single person unique and precious. We will look at belonging and being a part of a community. We will share occasions that have made us feel special.</p>	<p>Mathematics</p> <p><u>Number</u></p> <p>Children will build on previous experiences of number from their home and nursery environments, and further develop their subitising and counting skills. They will explore the composition of numbers within 5. They will begin to compare sets of objects and use the language of comparison</p> <p><u>Measure, Shape and Spatial Thinking:</u></p> <p>Compare Size, Mass and Capacity; Exploring Pattern; Circles and Triangles; Positional Language; Shapes with 4 Sides & Time.</p>	
		<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Development</p> <p>At the beginning of this term will we be developing our relationships with our teacher Miss Robinson and other adults that help us in school. We will be looking at fire, road safety as well as thinking about responsibility. Children will explore what it means to live in the wider world.</p>
