SUBJECT	DETAIL
Maths	<p><u>Task 1</u> Log on to the White Rose Maths Home Learning at the following address: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/ Select your year group from the list on the right-hand side</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin with Week 1, Lesson 1. For Year Six this is 'Using ratio language'; for Y5 this lesson is 'Decimals up to 2dp' • Watch the teaching video as it will guide you through the learning in a similar way to our Can Do Geometry lessons. • The worksheets to go with each video lesson can be found in the 'Get the Activity' section on the right-hand side of the video. You can either print these out or write the answers in your notebook. • The answers to the worksheets can be found in the 'Get the Answers' section below the 'Get the Activity' section. <p>There are five lessons for each week which means you can do one every day. Some of the lessons and activities you will have done before in class; others will be building on what you already know.</p> <p><u>Task 2</u> Continue with My Maths. You can use it to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete any of the Booster Pack work you have been given • Revisit any of the work you have done from the White Rose Home Learning site • Play the games to practise your skills <p><u>Task 3</u> Maths Games and Activities Pack. These are a selection of activities you can do to practise your skills and can be done in any order.</p>
Spelling and Vocabulary	<p><u>Task 1</u> You have been given five lists of ten spelling for this term. For each list you should:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn the spellings as you would for our normal weekly tests • Choose five words (one per day) to explore using the Vocabulary Investigation sheets. These are the same as we have been using for Vocabulary Preview work in Guided Reading. There are five different sheets for you to choose from for each investigation. You can either print these out or write directly into your notebook. <p>At the end of the five spelling lists, you will find a list of websites and apps that you might find useful to help with learning your spellings.</p> <p><u>Task 2</u> Continue to learn the words from the Year Five/Six Statutory Word List. The websites on the spelling lists in Task 1 will help with this.</p>
English	<p><u>The Tempest</u> I have put together a pack of work based on The Tempest as a follow-up to our workshop on 12th March.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For these activities, you will need to watch the animated version of The Tempest which can be found at the following address: https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/english-ks2-the-tempest-index/zfdshbk

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can explore the story further by using the songs linked to each episode at this address: https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/music-ks2-the-tempest-index/zfgcgwx There are ten tasks to complete which can be recorded in your notebook. At the end of the task sheet, there are some suggestions for further activities for you to try if you would like to. You could even try the quiz about each episode which can be found by scrolling down to the bottom of the website page containing the songs.
Reading	<p><u>Task 1</u></p> <p>You should be continuing to read regularly for at least twenty minutes five times per week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You have been given a variety of activities to complete at various stages of your reading – at the beginning of your book, towards the middle of your book and when you have finished reading your book. These are similar to the ones we have been using in Guided Reading this year. You can either print these out or write directly into your notebook. You should aim to complete three activities for each book you read. You do not need to make a note of each time you read.</p> <p><u>Task 2</u></p> <p>Continue with Read Theory. Your login details are in the back of your yellow Reading Record.</p>
Other Activities	<p>This is a list of other things that do:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Daily PE session with Joe Wicks. 9am Monday-Friday on his YouTube channel Lego 30-day Challenge. I have added these challenges to the home learning pack Sit in your garden and draw your house/garden from different angles. This could be sitting down, standing up, from the left-hand side, from the right-hand side, looking over your shoulder, looking through your legs, or any other creative way you can think of. Collect as many things as you can from your garden and use to make a picture or a sculpture. Fill a page with circles. Decorate each one differently and leave no gaps on the page.
