Other Ideas

- Write a newspaper report of either Prospero being overthrown by his brother Alonso and cast out to sea; the disappearance of King Alonso's ship; the return of Prospero and his daughter Miranda to Milan. Create your own artwork picture of the storm
- Draw and label what you think Caliban's den might have looked like. You could even make your own model of his den.
- Imagine you are one of the people shipwrecked on the island. Can you write a 'message in a bottle' to be thrown out to sea in the hope that someone will rescue you.
- Produce a care manual for Caliban
- Design a mask for one of the characters in the play
- Write a travel brochure or poster for the island
- You have been asked to produce a cover for a new version of The Tempest. Can you design a new illustration for the front cover and write a blurb in five sentences for the back cover.
- Write your own story set on a magical island. You will need to think about:
 - What seems strange about your island to the ordinary people who land there (for example, the island in The Tempest seems full of strange noises).
 - Which characters will be arriving on the island, and how they will get there? Have they been shipwrecked? Are they explorers? Were they intending to go to a different island, and ended up here by mistake?
 - Which characters will already be living on the island? In The Tempest, there was a magician, a princess, a fairy spirit and a witch's son. It is very useful to have 'good' and 'bad' characters to increase the tension in your story.
 - > How will the inhabitants of the island meet the newcomers? What will happen next?
