

P.E

We will be learning how to play tennis and playing lots of team and cooperative games.

We will also be carrying out athletics and team sports in preparation for Sports Day.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will continue to read, write and order numbers up to 100 and beyond. We will learn how to begin to group things in different ways and relate this to multiplication and division. We will learn how to add and take away 1 digit and 2 digit numbers and continue to use addition and subtraction in problem solving. We will be learning about fractions, time and money and continue to read and use simple charts and tables and make pictograms and graphs. We will continue to develop our reasoning skills and explain how we solve a variety of mathematical problems.

English

As authors we will be reading a wide range of fiction including Jack and the Beanstalk and Trust me that beanstalk stinks! The story of Jack and the beanstalk as told by the giant. We will also read a range of poetry, including performance poetry, and non-fiction, topic related texts. We will continue to learn about how to write short and longer stories aiming to include exciting and well-chosen vocabulary. We will also be carrying out dictionary work and writing instructions for preparing a healthy sandwich.

We will be continuously learning new vocabulary and spellings and focusing on cursive handwriting, punctuation and grammar.

Science

As scientists, we will be exploring the world of plants as young gardeners. We will be identifying and naming plants as well as learning how to grow our own produce. We will also be investigating a variety of materials and what materials are suitable for specific purposes. The children will also be furthering their scientific knowledge and questioning skills in our own Science Discovery Zone!

History

As historians, we will be looking at the lives of significant individuals from the past such as Christopher Columbus and Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama. We will find out how their discoveries impacted the world and lives of others. We will continue to explore and develop our knowledge of the past by asking questions.

Art/DT

As artists and designers, we will be using our designing skills to design and prepare a variety of healthy food. We will study the artist Giuseppe Arcimboldi and create our own food portraits. We will also study the work of Wayne Thiebaud and draw our own ice cream cones recreating this style.

Music

As musicians, we will listen with concentration to explore and evaluate a variety of music styles including classical and pop. We will continue to experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using our voices and instruments.

We will use our voices expressively and creatively by singing songs including our favourites learnt this year and also learn and perform the famous song from the musical Oliver, "Food, Glorious, Food."

Geography

As geographers, we will be learning about different types of food and where food comes from. We will also be studying human and physical features of the land including the seaside and make links to how food is sourced from the land and sea.

R.E/PSHE

In RE we will be continuing to learn about the Jewish faith, traditions, stories and festivals.

In PHSE we will be learning about how to deal with our changing emotions and how to keep healthy as well as how to keep ourselves and other's safe within a variety of contexts including internet safety.
