Below are the spelling lists for the first half of the Summer Term.

- Weeks 1 - 2 is a list of high frequency words taken from recent SATs papers.
- Week 3 is a list of important words linked to our current work about the Vikings. Both year groups have the same lists to learn for this week.
- Week 4 contains up to ten words linked to the current spelling objective being taught in class.
- Spellings will be usually tested on **Friday** of each week i.e. the week beginning date given for each list, and children will record their results in their Reading Records.
- In addition to these lists, children should also learn the given words on the statutory spelling list for Years Five and Six. All children will begin with List 1 and will progress to the next list when all five words have been learned. These words will be tested on **Wednesday** of each week, by dictation.

Please note.

- There is no spelling test for week beginning 12th May because Y6 SATs.
- Spelling test on week beginning 19th May 2025 will be on **Thursday** due to Inset day on the Friday.
